New Era For 'New' The Outrigger Kona

The revamped Outrigger Kona Resort & Spa at Keauhou Bay has completed its USD60 million makeover.

All 511 rooms at the 22-acre resort now sport a modern look inspired by the concept of koi au, which symbolises a flowing current.

There's also upgraded lounge chairs and cabanas at the adults-only and oceanfront pools, a new 60m waterslide, and for those staying in Club-level rooms, a new Voyager 47 Club Lounge.

Dukes Kona will also debut at the resort in late 2025, opening in an oceanfront location.

A chapel, and lawn space for events including weddings is available,

along with experienced wedding planners. The Kaleiopapa Convention Center has also been revamped and offers more than 30,480m² of indoor and outdoor space. A new Piko Coffee & Wine Bar has opened in the centre of the resort, with a wine list that includes wines from New Zealand.

. . . Activities

Among the highlights of the resort are the activities included in its nightly manta ray tours which are held on an Hawaiian sailing canoe, where guests will learn the myths and legends surrounding the manta ray before getting in the water and snorkelling alongside them.

There are also daily cultural activities, including a guided tour of the historic villages of Kaukulaelae and Keauhou Bay, and the Feast & Fire Lu'au, which features an Artisan Village where guests can make lei, watch a poi pounding demonstration, or shop for goods from local artisans.
