The lounge will be located at the entrance of the Mauka Concourse in Terminal One and will be five times bigger than HA's existing HNL lounge.

While the final design is yet to be revealed, the first design concepts are out now, with these largely inspired by Hawaii's rich natural elements. The addition of this new lounge follows on from HA opening a second Premier Club at Maui's Kahului Airport at the end of last year, the airline's sixth Premier Club in Hawai'i. The Smith Family Garden Lu'au in Kaua'i is located in Waila River Valley. The family-run celebration has been running for more than 50 years, featuring an Hawaiian feast complete with kalua pig, and entertainment including Hawaiian hula, Tahitian drum dances and a Samoan fire knife dance. But warn clients it is popular, with reservations recommended weeks in advance, as it quickly sells out. Alternatively, clients can volunteer with Waikoloa Dry Forest Initiative, which runs volunteer days on the second and fourth Sat each month, where members of the public and tourists can help with trail building, weed clearing, tree planting, and seed collection activities.
